The Dewi-Prys Thomas Prize is an award that recognises the importance of good design to the quality of life, identity and regeneration of Wales.

The prize builds on the work of the Dewi-Prys Thomas Trust in celebrating the life of this charismatic teacher and advocate for Wales and the Welsh environment. Dewi-Prys, who died in 1985, cared deeply about Wales and the Welsh environment and the prize seeks to capture this inspirational and passionate spirit.



Winner: Ruthin Craft Centre

In awarding the Dewi-Prys Thomas Prize to the Ruthin Craft Centre we acknowledge the quality of the architectural achievement of this new building which has replaced this respected centre's former inadequate accommodation. The architects, Sergison Bates, and their client have produced a building which is modern, characterful and sympathetic to both setting and purpose. At its heart is an elegant courtyard where the interaction of the activities of the workshops, galleries and café defines a place that both makes and displays art in a relaxed atmosphere, sociable for visitors and users alike. The distinctive roof form

hints at practicality, craft and functionality, while its profile suggests the lines of the Clwydian Hills nearby. With its touring exhibitions and publications, Ruthin Craft Centre has established a reputation in Europe and beyond. This new building offers a working base that recognises this international standard of excellence. Yet at the same time it offers a convivial focus for the local community and tourists. The architects have produced a building whose welcoming and approachable atmosphere satisfies local needs while bearing the sophisticated characteristics of an international cultural venue.

Pevsner's *The Buildings of Wales*

Since the publication of the first volume in the series of Pevsner's *The Buildings of Wales* in 1979, each new book has been welcomed as the definitive guide to the architecture of the country. In all, seven areas of Wales have been covered: *Powys*, the first, was followed by *Clwyd* (1986), *Glamorgan* (1995), *Gwent/Monmouthshire* (2000), *Pembrokeshire* (2004), *Carmarthenshire and Ceredigion* (2006) and finally, in 2009, *Gwynedd* has completed the series. The Buildings Book Trust, Yale University Press and the authors involved are to be congratulated on completing the series. Now, wherever you travel in Wales, a copy of the relevant 'Pevsner' will help to add knowledge, understanding and often a surge of sheer pleasure when encountering the buildings that form our cultural heritage.

Sue Essex

In commending the work of Sue Essex, we recognise her singular contribution to improving and enhancing the environment in Wales, in particular, her promotion of the values of good architecture and urban design. A politician with a professional background in the built environment, she brought an understanding of the complexities of design to her role as Assembly Member and Cabinet Minister for Environment, Transport and Planning when she entered the first Welsh Assembly Government in 2000. Her active involvement with planning professionals in reviewing planning policy led to the groundbreaking *Wales Spatial Plan*. That good design is central to the quality of life has featured throughout her work and she set in motion the mechanisms to promote the establishment of the Design Commission for Wales.

Judges' report

The Dewi-Prys Thomas Prize may be awarded to a building and its creators, an individual, or an organisation in recognition of a uniquely significant contribution to the quality of life in Wales through the medium of architecture.

Dewi himself made a unique contribution to the architecture of Wales, in particular to the contested idea of a self-consciously Welsh architecture. A committed modernist, yet he passionately promoted exploration of the nature of indigenous and appropriate design in his built work, notably at Pencadlys Gwynedd, Caernarfon, and most significantly through his charismatic teaching at the Welsh School of Architecture.

We believe that he would have been pleased to have seen the quality of modern architecture and environmental contributions that have been nominated for the award in his name. 2009 has produced a record 47 entries from organisations, agencies and individuals throughout Wales. They have ranged from art and heritage projects, landscape schemes, community buildings, publications, the contribution of individuals and organisations, bridges and commercial and public architecture. The team at **The Buildings Books Trust** and the Yale University Press is commended for completing the seven volumes of Pevsner's *The Buildings of Wales*. The undertaking of this gazetteer over a period of thirty years has been enormous. Dewi-Prys Thomas, who enthusiastically reviewed the first volume, *Powys*, on publication would have been delighted that the quality of his own major architectural work, Pencadlys, Caernarfon, was recognised in the last volume, *Gwynedd*.

In commending the work of **Sue Essex**, we recognise that a politician can positively affect the quality of the built environment by bringing into the political arena the professional expertise from her former discipline, and her conviction that good design is central to a better life. Over the relatively short period of time as a Welsh Assembly Government Minister, she effectively promoted groundbreaking legislation and guidance and was instrumental in establishing the Design Commission for Wales.

Enillydd: Canolfan Grefft Rhuthun

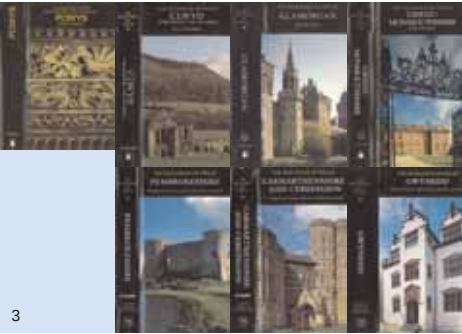
Wrth ddyfarnu Gwobr Dewi-Prys Thomas i Ganolfan Grefft Rhuthun rydym yn cydnabod ansawdd cyflawniad pensaernïol yr adeilad newydd hwn sydd wedi cymryd lle adeiladau annigonol blaenorol y ganolfan. Mae'r penseiri Sergison Bates, a'u cleient wedi cynhyrchu adeilad sydd yn fodern, yn llawn cymeriad ac yn dangos cydymdeimlad at y safle a'i bwrpas. Calon y safle yw cwrw lle mae rhyngweithredu gweithgareddau'r gweithdai, yr orielau a'r lle bwyta yn diffinio lle, sy'n gwneud ac yn arddangos celf, mewn amgylchedd hamddenol, ac sy'n gymdeithasol i ymwelwyr a defnyddwyr fel ei gilydd. Hyd yn hyn deliwyd gyda saith ardal o Gymru: yn gyntaf oedd Powys, a ddilynwyd gan Clwyd (1986), Glamorgan (1995), Gwent/Monmouthshire (2000), Pembrokeshire (2004), Carmarthenshire and Ceredigion (2006) ac yn olaf, yn 2009, mae Gwynedd wedi cwblhau'r gyfres. Rhaid llongyfarch The Buildings Book Trust, Yale University Press a'r awduron fu'n ymwneud â'r prosiect ar gwblhau'r gyfres. Sue Essex

Wrth gymeradwyo gwaith Sue Essex, rydym yn cydnabod ei chyfraniad unigol i wella amgylchedd Cymru, yn enwedig, y ffaith ei bod yn hyrwyddo gwerthoedd pensaernïaeth dda a chynllunio trefol. Mae hi'n wleidydd gyda chefnidir proffesiynol yn yr amgylchedd adeileddig ac mae wedi dod â dealltwriaeth o gymlethdodau dylunio i'w rôl fel Aelod Cynulliad a Gweinidog yn y Cabinet dros yr Amgylchedd, Trafnidiaeth a Chynllunio pan ddaeth yn aelod o'r Llywodraeth cyntaf yng Nghynulliad Cymru yn 2000. Mae ei hymrwymiad gweithredol gyda phroffesiynolwyr cynllunio wrth adolygu polisi cynllunio wedi arwain at *Gynllun Gofodol Cymru* arloesol. Gellir dyfarnu Gwobr Dewi-Prys Thomas i adeilad a'i grewyr, i unigolyn, neu i sefydliad mewn cydnabyddiaeth o gyfraniad unigryw sylweddol i ansadd bywyd yng Nghymru trwy gyfrwng pensaernïaeth.

Gwnaeth Dewi ei hun gyfraniad unigryw i bensaernïaeth Cymru, yn enwedig i'r syniad dadleuol o bensaernïaeth Cymreig hunanymwybodol. Roedd yn fodernydd ymroddgar, ac eto, roedd yn hyrwyddo archwilio natur dyluniad cynhenid ac addas, yn frwydfrydig, yn ei waith adeileddig, yn enwedig ym Mhencadlys Gwynedd, Caernarfon ac yn fwyaf arwyddocaol trwy ei addysgu carismataidd yn Ysgol Bensaernïaeth Cymru.

Credwn y byddai wedi bod yn falch i weld ansawdd pensaernïaeth fodern a'r cyfraniadau amgylcheddol a enwebwyd ar gyfer y dyfarniad yn ei enw. Mae cynhyrchu'r mynegai hwn dros gyfnod o ddeng mlynedd ar hugain wedi bod yn enfawr.
